NOTICE REGARDING REDUCED PAPER MODULE THROUGH CM/ECF *Effective April 1, 2008*

The Administrative Office of the United States Courts has requested that the courts implement a module in the CM/ECF program which will allow courts to remove registered CM/ECF email recipients from the Bankruptcy Noticing Center mailing list so that the sole method of receiving notices from the court is through email, eliminating generation and mailing of paper notices. Under the Reduced Paper Module, debtors, creditors, and other parties who are not registered CM/ECF users will continue to receive paper notices through the Bankruptcy Noticing Center.

The Reduced Paper Module will provide better service to CM/ECF users by eliminating the need for attorneys to sort through duplicate paper and electronic notices.

With the implementation of the Reduced Paper Module on April 1, 2008, it is imperative that, if you are a registered CM/ECF user, you keep your email address updated on-line through the CM/ECF system, as this will be the only means of receiving notices, etc. from the court. Maintenance of a current email address and password is the total responsibility of the registered CM/ECF user.
